Description 2 portfolios ([32] leaves of plates (some col.) : ill., ports., music) ; 50 cm.

Note In Latin, Greek or English.

Collection title and titles in contents note devised by cataloger.

Summary This collection includes mounted pages from incunabula, manuscripts and early printed books with descriptions written on 3 X 5" cards attached to most leaves.

Rethinking Tech Services

How we used the Tisch Miscellany to
reshape Technical Services



Tisch Tech Services in 2008



- Very traditional workflows – entirely print based
- Electronic resources (journals) were managed in Collections
- Few e-book collections, if MARC records were loaded they were done by Systems Librarian
- No thought was given to non-MARC metadata



How did we get there?

- Communication
- Looking for an opportunity

- Advocating for Technical Services within the Library
- Advocating for Technical Services outside the Library
