

Building a Shared Print Network in New England and Beyond, April 8, 2016

Nine institutions in Maine came together to form the Maine Shared Collections Strategy (MSCS), a collaborative effort to manage legacy print collections. The work of MSCS was supported by a grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services. Since the grant ended we have been working with libraries across Maine on analyzing their print collections and now have thirty plus members. We hope that other libraries will learn from our experiences in developing their own shared print

networks. Although we would do some things differently (if we had the chance), this project has proven that diverse partners can work together in cooperative collection development.
